Genesis 1:26–2:25

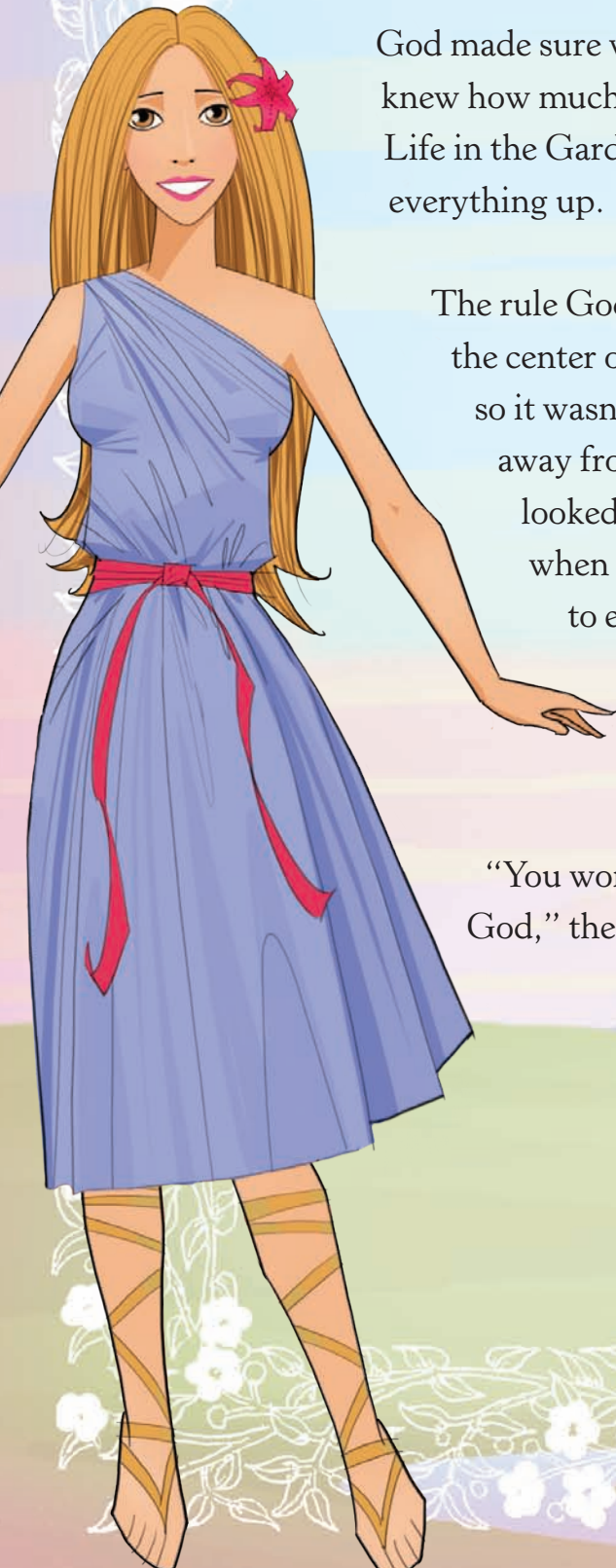
Mirror, mirror on the wall,

### Eve's Story

I am the first princess. I was the very first woman God created. Adam was the first man. God made him by using dirt from the ground and breathing God's own breath into him. God used one of Adam's ribs to make me, the first woman!

Adam and I lived in the Garden of Eden. It was a beautiful, happy place that God made for us. The Garden was full of gentle rivers, beautiful flowers, big trees, butterflies, swans, horses, and any other kind of animal you can think of.
